KOREAN ADOPTEE COMMUNITY IS RICH PART OF HCC HISTORIC DONATION

The lasting picture may be a check presentation, but the story behind it is one of resilience. Thomas Clement, a Korean-born adoptee who came to the United States and built a career as a distinguished inventor, author and philanthropist, is part of a Howard Community College adoptee community that finds joy in their shared experiences and close-knit relationships.

Alongside his wife and acclaimed artist Wonsook Kim, Clement became a historic donor to the college in August, donating \$2.5 million to HCC's Engineering program and student scholarships. It is the single largest donation in school history and will support equipment upgrades and resources to build public and private partnerships in the college's interdisciplinary science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) programming.

"We are grateful to Thomas and Wonsook for such heartfelt and timely support of our faculty and student scholars," said HCC President Daria J. Willis. "We envision laboratories, learning spaces, and training opportunities that will expand our community's curiosity and potential. I could not be more excited about our relationship with this family and the long-term outcomes this gift will create."

During the presentation, Clement credited his relationship with several Korean adoptees who work on campus and their support of the college as the catalysts for his giving.

"I was pleased to know that they all work at Howard, and that created an initial level of security and understanding," he said.

Rebecca Swick, Kim Pavlovsky, and her sister Kristin all stood with Clement during the presentation. They have served over 44 years at the college collectively in various roles and take pride in Clement's place in college history.

"The fact that he was adopted and went through the trials and tribulations, to be with his wife, to be able to help the department



that he's assisting... I am very excited and honored that he was willing to donate the way he did to help better the school," said Kim, a teaching and learning operations manager who has been with HCC for two years.

Kim and Kristin say that growing up around the campus helped to build their love for the institution, which has translated into a deep passion for helping students and guiding them to success. Their mother worked at the college for 35 years in continuing education before retiring in 2015, which led to their opportunities as students and now employees.

But life as an adoptee, even in a diverse place like HCC, wasn't always easy. The culture surrounding adoption in Korea is taboo and often creates cultural divides among Koreans born and raised in the country, and those who immigrate to the United States.

"Thomas and I are among the first generations, and we were treated a lot differently than future generations," said Rebecca Swick, a basic skills information, intake, and assessment assistant who has worked for 24 years at the college. "The 80's were a big time for adoptees. Korea still does not do within the country, and if they do, it's like the 50's where they hide it and don't tell anybody that the child is adopted."

"I don't think it's quite as bad, but the stigma is still there. Because I work with the English Language Center, the Koreans who are native-born and raised in the culture tended not to want to interact with me as much. Because I was learning Korean, they went to native speakers to discuss their enrollment."

"Adoption in Korea is very taboo and very shameful," said Kristin, a curriculum services manager. "People born and raised in Korea look at us differently. We want to be accepted by Americans but



embraced by Koreans as well. Growing up, we go through an identity crisis. Navigating those emotions can be difficult and confusing.”

Clement is personally invested in adoptees’ connections and identities. He has helped facilitate DNA testing to help adoptee immigrants across the United States access their family histories and add information to Korean registries.

“The Korean adoptee community is worldwide, and we share a certain bond through similar early experiences like orphanage and abandonment,” Clement said.

Despite the complex cultural nuances in the US and Korea, Clement says that community colleges’ culture of inclusivity bodes well for diverse stakeholders and that HCC is particularly good at helping all community members feel seen.

“I think you’re doing a good job of that right now. A lot of adoptees are fine with being identified as adoptees and that visibility allows others to have a certain level of security knowing there’s a presence there,” he said. “Being invited to the signing instead of being overlooked and invisible was a big deal for us.”

“This is an amazing institution,” Kristin said. “I’ve had a really positive experience here and the connections I’ve made with students and my colleagues are of great importance to me. There is a collective dedication and commitment that the work we do is not about us—it is for our students.”

“Dr. Willis is meeting students where they dream, and that’s exactly what we’re here to do,” Kim says. “With all aspects of education, the people here are that way. Everybody has a heart, cares for students, and wants them to succeed.”
